The American Red Cross is facing an emergency blood shortage as it experiences the lowest number of people giving blood in the last 20 years. The number has decreased by 40% in the last 2 decades. You can sign up at lunch in the amphitheater Tuesday through Friday this week or in room 37 at break and lunch until then.
