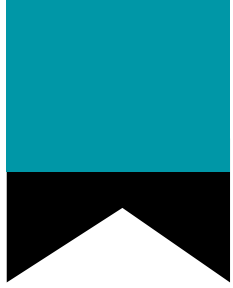




# Hummingbirds

# Hummingbird Habitat

Hummingbirds can live in many different places. They can live in woodlands, mountain meadows, cloud forests, tropical rainforests, and deserts. They can also live in your backyard! You mostly see Hummingbirds by a big group of flowers, or hovering above some bushes. Hummingbirds are sucking the pollen out of the flower!

# Hummingbird Nests



- Hummingbirds nests are made out of sticks, spider web, little bits of leaves, and fiber plants. Here is the process of making the nest: The mother weaves some sticks together and puts some spider web inside so it is soft. Then, she puts some moss and leaves to make in camouflage.

# Food

Hummingbirds eat mosquitoes, spiders, gnats, fruit flies, and small bees. When the mother or father comes home, the baby hummingbirds put their beaks up and the parent drops the food into their mouths.
