### **Principal's report**

Dan discussed that there was no clear decision made on how the 2020/2021 school year would look. That the district was looking at different options including fully re-opening, a hybrid model and total distance learning. But that due to the nature of the virus' activity, more time was needed before a decision could be made. He said that if the schools decided to distance-teach – he would work on getting a reliable schedule/format for all students (as that was a common thread in the feedback from parents – that the curriculum and teacher formats were varied and some teachers taught live and others didn't, etc.). His goal is to make sure that the teaching is much more even, scheduled and clear. He offered the possibility that all teachers would hold office hours on campus in order to ensure a clear schedule as well as consistent internet reliability/access.
