

Mr. Knight, Ms. Johnson,

1) Thank you Mr. Knight for forwarding the public update. We were aware that you had posted the update at some point Friday evening before the weekend. We look forward to reviewing your updated EIR in detail.

2) I am attaching the letters from your counsel, Ms. Johnson. Ms. Johnson,

A) Please explain to us the point of the information that you provided. Nothing personal ( and I am not a lawyer ), but as a lay person, it was nonsense. You provided no reasoning behind the Board's decision, ability and expertise to decide that the Performing Arts Center, pool and pool lights were/are exempt. Although its up to the courts to decide on the validity of their actions, but not based upon the current process that your board is going through, it appears that certain laws, regulations and processes were either crossed or perhaps not followed. As you are a former Goucho, I I look forward to your input. Btw, imagine the lagoon in front of the campus student center lit up like you advocating for the lights at CHS. I doubt, you would like it. Btw, when you do get a moment, if you can please return my two phone calls, I would appreciate it.

B) Mr. Knight or Ms. Johnson, please highlight the difference between the 2008 ( Perf Center, pool, pool lights ) event and the current event. In short, as it applies to my A) Why is an EIR necessary now, but was not necessary in 2008. Please highlight community outreach, notifications and other mechanisms that you used to invite and engage the community in what you were doing. As you are now going on your second EIR report, as the first one literally stated that there would be damages that could not be mitigated, it surprising that the same protocols would not be followed in 2008. Perhaps I am mistaken, but I don't believe the laws, regulations and other environmental and community based laws have changed. If I am wrong, please let me know.

3) Again, thank you Mr. Knight for your correspondence. Out of abundance of caution,

I am BCC'ing all on this email. I would encourage that you to do the same as we want to make sure everyone feels able to communicate and that everyone is safe as this may become a bit heated. I have included you and the other board members as you are public individuals, but the people on the list of community members are entitled to a degree of privacy - unless for the public record - as this note is. Mr. Knight, we certainly would like to support you to do the right thing by the kids and the community. We have suggested a number of ideas, besides lights at CHS, such as a modern, environmentally sensitive sports complex on the south side of CMS, perhaps slightly below grade and covered so that it can be used for all seasons and rented out during the many international events on the peninsula. I suspect that you could even have a company sponsor it to defer the majority of expenses. For CUSD to have the most modern, environmentally sensitive sports complex in the nation would be very cool - at least in modest opinion.
